After retiring in October 2008 and moving home to Pennsylvania—he was born and reared in New Kensington—he served for almost five years as Interim at St. Brendan's in Franklin Park and, after a four-month sabbatical, began in February as Priest-in-Charge at St. Paul's in Kittanning. He serves on the Calvary Camp Board and on the Strategic Task Force Committee, and he coleads the *Fresh Start* program for clergy in transition.
